2. Personal and Work Area Safety

A.



Always wear ANSI approved safety goggles.

B.

F. **While assembling and when installing or loading/unloading the cargo rack, keep the work area clean and well lit. Keep bystanders and children out of the work area.**

3. Use of the Cargo Rack

A. Do not modify the cargo Rack and do not use this product for purposes that it was not designed for.


B. **Never exceed the maximum load capacity of 70kg (150lbs). Distribute weight evenly in the cargo rack.**

C. **Be aware of the danger of “dynamic loading”.** This situation may occur if a load is *dropped* onto the cargo rack, resulting in a sudden, excessive load. Dynamic loading can result in damage and failure of the cargo rack, damage to the vehicle and/or personal injury.

D. Never carry people or animals in the cargo rack. Keep children and bystanders away when loading, unloading and using this product.

E. Adhere to all mandated road safety requirements when using this product. Always use ropes and straps to securely hold the cargo in place.

F. For the vehicle that will support the cargo rack, read all pertinent vehicle instructions and warnings provided in the owner's manual. **Make sure that the vehicle has appropriate roof racks required to securely and safely mount the cargo rack mounting brackets.** Make sure the vehicle engine is OFF, with the parking brake ON, before loading or unloading the cargo rack.

G.  **WARNING** This product requires complete assembly and set-up on the vehicle. Depending on the height of the vehicle, use of a platform or ladder may be required. Use extreme caution when using a platform/ladder to prevent accidents. If you are not experienced or capable of installing the product, seek assistance from a suitably qualified or experienced person.

H. Never attempt to carry a load that is wider than the vehicle.

I. Obey all speed limits and traffic laws. Adhere to all state and local regulations regarding roof mounted loads.

J. Always check all hardware for tightness prior to each use. Replace ropes and straps used to hold cargo at the first signs of wear.

K. Use caution when driving near low clearance structures or objects that could interfere with the cargo rack and its contents.

L. Do not attempt to mount the cargo rack on trailers or towed vehicles.

M. Maintain labels and nameplates on the cargo rack. They contain important information and must always remain readable. Contact the supplier for replacements.

Keep in mind that the warnings previously discussed cannot cover all possible conditions or situations that could occur. It is important that the person setting up and using this product understand that common sense and caution are factors which cannot be built into this product, and must be supplied by the person(s) using this product.

Assembly and Set-Up



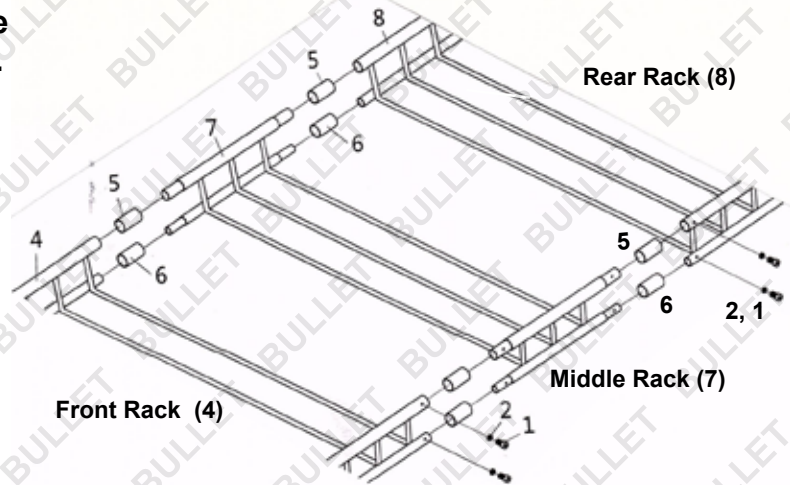
Always wear ANSI approved safety goggles.



1. Refer to photo above of an assembled cargo rack and the assembly diagram at end of this manual.

2. Place all components on a flat surface. Identify the front rack (4), middle rack (7) and rear rack (8).

3. From the following illustration, note how the three rack sections are attached.



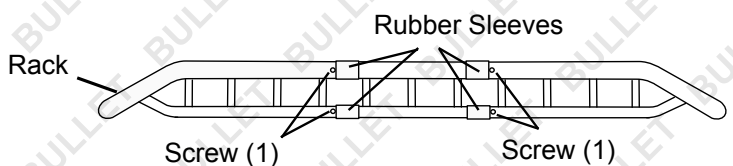
4. Lubricate the inside of each rubber sleeve (5/6) with a small amount of grease (not supplied) to assist with installation and help keep moisture out of the rack joints.

5. Slide a rubber sleeve onto each middle rack (7) tube - larger sleeves on the upper rail; smaller sleeves on the lower rail. Slide each sleeve about 50mm from the edge of the tubes.

6. Insert the middle rack (7) tubes into the front rack (4) tubes. Line up the screw holes and secure the sections together using 4 screws (1) and washers (2).

7. Secure the middle rack (7) to the rear rack (8) in same manner as described in step 6.

8. With the 3 rack sections secured together, slide all 8 rubber sleeves (5/6) back so that they are against the screws (1) as shown below.



9. Attach the wind deflector (3) to the front rack (4) using 4 screws (1) and washers (2).

10. With the cargo rack assembled, begin planning installation of the rack to the vehicle roof racks. The cargo rack attaches to the roof rack cross bars using 4 mounting brackets (10) and spacers (11).

11. The mounting brackets (10) and spacers (11) should be set up in the widest position possible (towards the outer corners of the cargo rack). This will vary depending on the vehicle and whether the vehicle roof rack cross bars are adjustable. If the roof rack cross bars are adjustable, they should be set at the widest position (farthest apart from each other) that will accommodate attachment of the cargo rack; this positioning will make for better load distribution.

12. **Attaching the mounting brackets and spacers:** The first step is to attach each spacer (11) to the underside of the cargo rack in the required position for each mounting bracket. Push each spacer into the rack so it "clips" into position.

13. Place the cargo rack on top of the vehicle roof rack cross bars. The spacers should sit evenly on each cross bar.

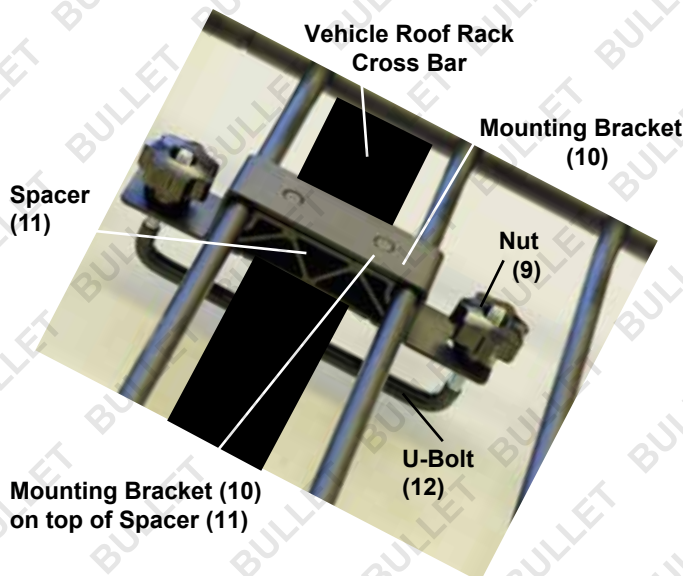
14. Place each mounting bracket (10) into position so it is sitting on the spacer and over the cargo rack tubes. From under the roof rack cross bar, insert a U-bolt (12) so the threaded sections pass through the holes in the mounting bracket. Secure the U-bolt with 2 nuts (9) - do not fully tighten the nuts yet.

15. Repeat step 14 for all mounting brackets, then double-check the position of the cargo rack. Make sure all spacers (11) are correctly aligned with the vehicle roof rack cross bars - adjust the mounting brackets positions if required, then firmly tighten all nuts (9) to secure the cargo rack in place.



A minimum 13mm of threads on each U-Bolt (12) must be engaged with each nut (9). Less than this may result in the nuts loosening, resulting in possible damage to cargo, vehicle, cargo rack and/or personal injury.

16. Before using the cargo rack, make sure that the vehicle roof rack cross bars are secure. Check that all cargo rack screws and nuts are fully secure and that all straps and ropes for holding the load are undamaged and secure. Check that the operation of the vehicle doors, boot etc do not interfere with the cargo rack. If vehicle has a sun-roof, make sure its operation is not affected by the cargo rack.



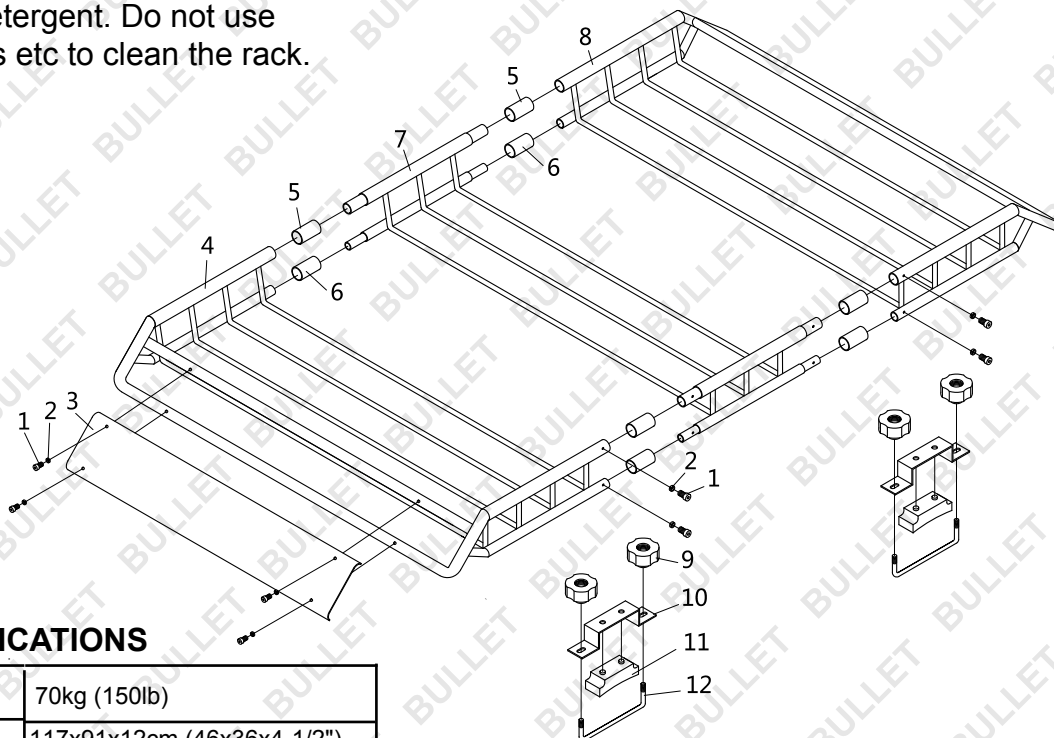
Using the Cargo Rack

1. **⚠ WARNING** Make sure the vehicle is safe for loading or unloading the cargo rack. Make sure the vehicle engine is OFF and the parking brake ON.
2. **Do not exceed the maximum load capacity of 70kg (150lbs).** Evenly distribute the load on the cargo rack. Ensure that the load is secured using suitbale ties, ropes, netting etc.
3. Before each use, check the tightness of all hardware and nuts. Frequently check the condition of the cargo rack and ensure all components are in good condition. If the cargo rack becomes damaged through accident, or if any damage is noted, the product should be replaced.
4. Keep the product clean using a soft cloth, water and mild detergent. Do not use abrasive, solvents etc to clean the rack.

Assembly Diagram

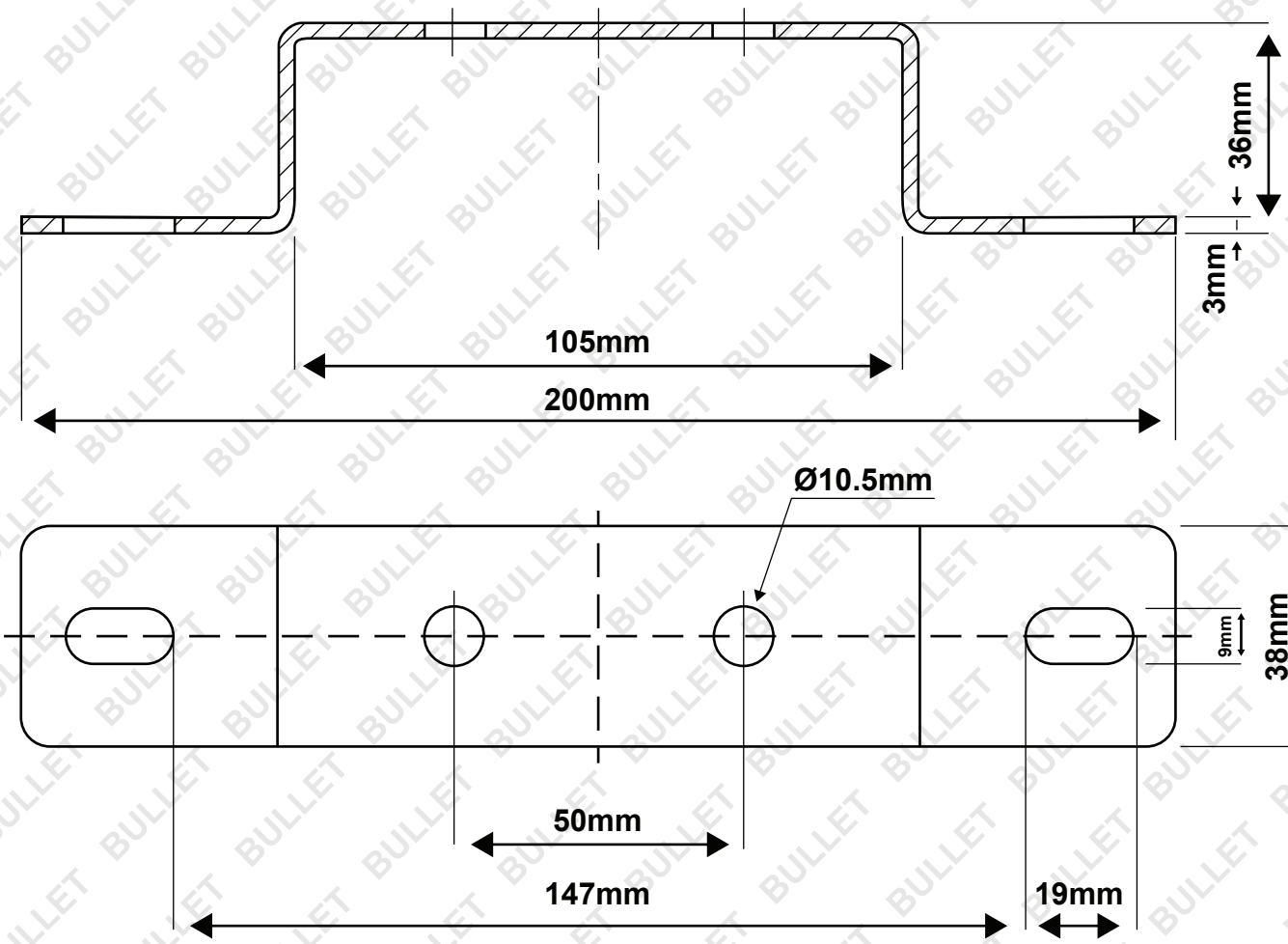
