Safety

Safety messages are designed to alert you to possible dangers or hazards that could cause death, injury or equipment or property damage if not understood or followed. Safety messages have the following symbols:

It is vital that you read and understand this user manual before using the product, including safety warnings, and any assembly and operating instructions. Keep the manual for future reference.

Safety precautions and recommendations detailed here must be fully understood and followed to reduce the risk of injury, fire, explosion, electrical hazard, and/or property damage.

Safety information presented here is generic in nature – some advice may not be applicable to every product. The term "equipment" refers to the product, be it electrical mains powered, battery powered or combustion engine powered.

- Before Use** - If you are not familiar with the safe operation/handling of the equipment or are in any way unsure of any aspect of suitability or correct use for your application, you should complete training conducted by a person or organization qualified in safe use and operation of this equipment, including fuel/electrical handling and safety.
- Do NOT operate the equipment in flammable or explosive environments, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. The equipment may create sparks or heat that may ignite flammable substances.
- Keep clear of moving parts.
- Equipment may be a potential source of electric shock or injury if misused.
- Do NOT operate the equipment if it is damaged, malfunctioning or is in an excessively worn state.
- Do NOT allow others to use the equipment unless they have read this manual and are adequately trained.
- Keep packaging away from children - risk of suffocation! Operators must use the equipment correctly. When using the equipment, consider conditions and pay due care to persons and property.

General Work Area Safety

General Fuel Safety

- Do NOT smoke near fuel or when refuelling.
- Always shut off the engine before refuelling.
- Do NOT refuel a hot engine.
- Open the fuel cap carefully to allow any pressure build-up in the tank to release slowly.
- Always refuel in well ventilated areas.

- Use combustion engines **OUTSIDE** only, and far away from windows, doors and vents.

General Equipment Use and Care

- The equipment is designed for domestic use only.
- Handle the equipment safely and carefully.
- Before use, inspect the equipment for misalignment or binding of moving parts, loose components, damage or any other condition that may affect its operation. If damaged, have the equipment repaired by an authorised service centre or technician before use.
- Prevent unintentional starting of the equipment - ensure equipment and power switches are in the OFF position before connecting or moving equipment. Do not carry equipment with hands or fingers touching any controls. Remove any tools or other items that are not a part of the equipment from it before starting or switching on.

Portable Fridge/Freezer Safety

- Warning:** Do not touch exposed cables with your bare hands when operating the appliance.
- Warning:** It is dangerous to touch the plug when your hands are wet.
- When using the refrigerator in a vehicle or boat, please make sure the electricity has a fuse if using the mains power.
- The installation of the DC power source in a boat should be handled by a qualified technician.
- Make sure the voltage is right. On the technical data label, there is the voltage data.
- Do not place any electrical devices inside the refrigerator.
- The appliance should not be exposed to rain. Keep the appliance away from water.
- Please keep the appliance away from substances that can cause sparks/fires.**
- The appliance is not intended for use by young children or infirm persons unless they have been adequately supervised by a responsible person to ensure that they can use the unit safely.
- Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Your refrigerator requires good ventilation, especially around the back of the refrigerator. Allow a gap of at least 200mm around the back and 100mm around the right.
- Avoid humidity: Humidity inside the appliance can form frost and impair cooling. Defrost it before this happens. Never clean the appliance under running water or in dish water.
- Avoid placing your refrigerator near a heat source. This helps the refrigerator to work more efficiently and keep the contents cool.
- Place the refrigerator on a flat surface and away from any edges. When placing the refrigerator into the car, please use a belt to fasten it.
- Never place hot food or drink in the refrigerator.**
- Please remove the door before you dispose your refrigerator.

Operation



On first time use of the portable fridge/freezer, it is recommended that you let it sit for at least 12 hours first before connecting it to a power source, the same as with a normal fridge. This is to stabilise the compressor after delivery.

Power

The electronic device can control the compressor system and can also function as a battery protector. When the input voltage reaches the minimum, it can stop the compressor; when the voltage comes back to the normal value, the compressor will automatically restart.

Battery Protection

By selecting the Low, Med or High switch position, you can choose different levels for battery protection. From the table below, you can find the battery tension values when the compressor stops running (cut-out) and when the compressor restarts working (cut-in).

Buzzing

1. If you press any button, the refrigerator will have a buzzer alarm sound.
2. When the battery gauge displays the gear to 1, a buzzer alarm will sound off.



- AC Max Cable Length: 0.75mm² or 18AWG
- Temperature setting range: -18 – 10°C
- LCD Display range: -20 – 40°C

Control Panel Features



- Press the **UP** or **DOWN** button to adjust the temperature the unit aims to achieve. Press the **UP** button to increase or the **DOWN** button to decrease the temperature.
- **ON/OFF power button:** Hold the **ON/OFF** button for 3 seconds to turn the unit off, hold the **ON/OFF** button for 3 seconds to turn unit on.
If the power source is cut off or disconnected, the unit will switch off automatically. Once the power is restored, it will automatically switch back ON with the same settings.
- Press the **Compressor Speed Button** to set the speed of the compressor.
MAX (3000 RPM), ECO (2500 RPM); the LCD light will show which speed is selected.
- Press the **Battery Protection Button** to set the voltage. The fridge cuts out at LOW, MED or HIGH. The LCD light will show which voltage is selected.

- Press the **Light Button**, then the light of the left and right cabinet will turn on and the LCD will light-up. Press the **Light Button** again to turn the light off. If you forgot to turn off the right cabinet, the light will turn off automatically in three minutes or later.
- If the power supply is cut off, the refrigerator will switch on automatically when the power supply has returned.
- If you press any button, the refrigerator will sound a buzzer alarm.

Maintenance

- Be sure to disconnect the fridge/freezer from the power source first before performing and cleaning/maintenance on it.
- Clean the appliance inside and out with a damp cloth every week. If it is dirty, use a mixture of sodium bicarbonate dissolved in lukewarm water, and then clean it.
- Never use abrasive products, detergents or soap. After washing, rinse with clean water and dry carefully. Do not leave the refrigerator shut off, warn inside, with food inside or lid closed.
- Never clean the appliance under running water or in dish water. Do not use abrasive cleaning agents or hard objects during cleaning as these can damage the refrigerator.



Troubleshooting

Troubleshooting Table

The following information may assist in identifying a problem and rectifying it.

Note: Some procedures listed here may need to be performed by a qualified service technician.

The Fridge/Freezer isn't working	Check the power supply <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Whether the plug and the socket have a good connection ▪ Whether the fuse has been burned out ▪ Whether the appliance has been turned on
The food inside is frozen	The temperature setting is too low
Bad performance in refrigeration	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Too much food inside the refrigerator ▪ The door is unlocked ▪ The door seal is broken ▪ Problems arising from poor ventilation ▪ There is too much heated food inside ▪ There is no room around the appliance ▪ There is a hot source around the appliance ▪ The temperature setting is inappropriate
Hearing the sound of water inside the refrigerator	This is normal due to the flow of refrigerant
Hearing loud noises	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The refrigerator is not placed on a level surface ▪ The refrigerator is touching a wall or surface ▪ The parts fall off the interior of the refrigerator

Error Codes

Code	Error instruction
E5	Compressor controller overheat protection. Cooling system over loaded or ambient temperature too high, causing the compressor mould to overheat.
E4	Compressor motor turning speed error
E3	Compressor motor start error. The motor block or cooling system pressure is too high (greater than 5bar).
E2	Fan over current (control module fan over 1Amp).
E1	Battery protection (pressure over cutting setting).
