



# EG-40E Electric Grill

## User Manual

# Safety

- **Electric shock/electrocution hazard** - NEVER immerse the electrical cord or thermostat in water.
- Unplug the appliance from the electrical supply while not in use, when assembling or changing accessories, and before cleaning.
- Switch off power at the appliance and the mains outlet before unplugging the power cord. Do not unplug the cord by pulling on it.
- Do not use the appliance with a damaged cord or plug or if the unit has been dropped, or is otherwise damaged. Contact an authorised service centre if this is the case.
- Ensure the appliance is used on a flat, level and stable surface. Do NOT operate on sloping, wet, unstable or slippery surfaces.
- Keep the appliance thermostat away from water. Do not connect the thermostat to the electrical supply if it is wet.
- Disconnect the appliance from the electrical supply and allow it to cool completely before cleaning, moving or storing it.
- Do not use the grill for more than 40 minutes continuously or damage to the unit may result. Allow the appliance to cool sufficiently before using again.
- Some surface of the appliance may be extremely hot during and after use. Do NOT touch hot surfaces – always use handles and wear suitable heat-protective gloves etc.
- Take due care when opening the appliance during or after use as steam / hot air escaping may cause injury.
- The appliance is for domestic use only.
- Do not use the appliance outdoors. Covered outdoor areas such as patios etc that have protected electrical sockets may be suitable.
- Do not cover the appliance when in use.
- Do not leave the appliance unattended while in use.
- Supervision is necessary when using the appliance near children.
- Do not allow children to operate or play with the appliance.
- Lift/carry the unit by holding it with both hands. Do not carry the unit by the power cord.
- Do not use the appliance for any purpose other than it is designed for.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge. All users should have adequate training in safely operating the product or be under supervision of a person responsible for their safety

## Before First Use

- Unpack the appliance.
- Check that the voltage indicated on the rating label corresponds to the mains voltage.
- Wash the grill plate and cover in warm water and mild detergent. Rinse and dry.
- Before use, ensure the thermostat is in the "lowest / OFF" position.

## Parts Identification

# Assembly

1. Place the base (A) on a solid and level surface, then insert the narrow end of the stand tube (B) into the base. Push the stand tube firmly into the base so that there is no "wobble".



2. Slide the accessory tray (C) over the stand tube. It is in the correct position when the screw in the stand tube engages with the groove in the tray (D).
3. Place the grill body (E) in position on top of the stand tube – ensure that the drip tray hole is lined up with the accessory tray handle. Push the grill body firmly onto the stand tube so there is no "wobble".



4. Insert the grill plate (F) into the grill body – tilt it slightly so the electrical socket (G) enters the hole in the grill body, then gently lower it. Ensure that the locating pins under the grill plate go into the recesses in the grill body and the drip tray (H) is aligned with the slot in the grill body.



5. Hold the grill cover (I) in a near vertical position so the hinge tabs align with the slots in the cover brackets (J), then gently lower the cover until the tabs and brackets "click" into position. Ensure that the cover can be opened and closed smoothly – if not, it has not been inserted correctly.

## Operation



Disconnect the appliance from the electrical supply and allow it to cool before cleaning, moving or storing it. • Do not use the grill for more than 40 minutes continuously or damage to the unit may result. Allow the appliance to cool sufficiently before using again. • Some surface of the appliance may be extremely during and after use. Do NOT touch hot surfaces – always use handles and wear suitable heat-protective gloves etc. • Take due care when opening the appliance during or after use as steam / hot air escaping may cause injury.

The appliance uses a "thermostat" control for adjusting the grill plate temperature. To use the appliance:

Insert the thermostat (K) into the grill plate electrical connector (G). Ensure that the alignment pin (L) on the end of the thermostat enters the hole in the grill plate and that the "groove" under the thermostat slides over the "tongue" in the grill body (M).

Rotate the dial (N) on the thermostat with reference to the pointer (O) to set the grill plate temperature, as required.


Connect the appliance electrical cord to a standard 240VAC power outlet and switch ON – the appliance begins heating. Keep the cover down to speed up the heating process



When the grill plate is heating, the "arrow" on the thermostat illuminates. When the required temperature is reached, the lamp switches off.

## Temperature Setting

The approximate thermostat control temperature settings are below. When the grill plate is heating, the "arrow" on the thermostat illuminates.



## Cooking Guide

The following tips should be followed:

- Pre-heat the grill to the required temperature before grilling.
- Brush or spray a little vegetable or olive oil onto the grill plate before cooking.
- Leave adequate space between foods to produce more even cooking.
- Marinades – turn and brush marinades frequently onto foods.
- Foods containing fat, such as beef, sausages, pork etc may splatter during cooking.
- Some foods, such as ribs or thick sausages should be partially cooked before grilling to help prevent over-cooking the outside and under-cooking the inside of the food.

Food	Temperature	Duration (Minutes)
Beef steak (approximately ½" / 12mm thick)	200°C	10 to 15
Chicken breast	180°C	20 to 30
Pork chops	165°C	15 to 20
Hamburger patties	190°C	10 to 15
Hot dogs	165°C	10 to 15
Sausages	175°C	5 to 10
Fish fillet	165°C	10 to 15
Bacon	165°C	10 to 12
Vegetables	165°C	10 to 15
Pancakes	165°C	10 to 15

## Cleaning and Maintenance

- Before cleaning, switch OFF, then unplug the thermostat from the appliance.
- Allow the appliance to cool completely before cleaning.
- Clean the body and cover of the appliance with a damp sponge and allow to dry.
- Clean the grill plate using warm water and a mild detergent and a sponge or dishcloth – wipe away all soap residues thoroughly and dry after cleaning. Do NOT immerse the grill plate in water.
- Do not use metal brushes or abrasives for cleaning the food dehydrator; it may damage the surface.
- Regularly drain and clean the drip tray.
